Topic: Slang

Grade: 10 or 11 Time: 90 minutes Objective: Students will understand how to use informal speech by learning different American slang words/phrases. Materials: Slang Words (Phrases Elashcards, Slang Meaning Elashcards

Materials: Slang Words/Phrases Flashcards, Slang Meaning Flashcards

Warm Up - What is Slang? (5 min)

- Ask the students to define slang by raising hand
- Ask them to give some examples of slang in Bahasa Indonesia

Main Activity 1: Flashcard Slang (20 min)

- Have the students pair up
- Give each pair 2-3 flashcards
 - On the front of each flashcard, write one American slang word or phrase (see table for slang and meanings)
- Give the students a couple of minutes to write what they think the slang means on the back of the flashcard
 - Be sure to tell them not to use their phones!
- While they come up with definitions, put flashcards with the meanings at the front of the room
- The students will have to find the flashcard with the meaning that matches their own definition

Lesson - Defining Slang (30 min)

- Go in order and have each student give their own definition of the slang
 - Have your co-teacher write down the slang word/phrase during this time
- Be sure to give them the actually meaning of the slang and an example of how to use the slang in a sentence or situation

Main Activity 2 - Slang Convos (30 min)

- Have the students in their same pairs create their own conversation using the slang they just learned
- Have some of the pairs present their conversations to the class

Closing - Review (5 minutes)

- Say different sentences using slang
- Have the students translate what you're saying

Notes:

I used this lesson plan for English Camp. I brought one of my Australian friends with me and changed the lesson to include Aussie slang as well. We talked about how we both speak English but still manage to not understand each other because we have different slang. So if you do know people in your area that are from Australia or the UK, they can make for great guest speakers. The students really enjoyed learning more "practical" speech!
